2. Office/Unit/Project Description

Iraq's transition to a more stable, safe and cohesive country is hampered by several factors including social division and state-citizen mistrust. Thousands of returnees including families perceived as affiliated with the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) currently located in camps in Iraq and Syria require urgent support to ensure safe and humane return, reintegration, and rehabilitation. As these camps close, and more people leave or escape from them to a country and communities already affected by the drivers of violent extremism, there is a risk of perpetuating further cycles of violence, including through stigmatization, discrimination, and retaliation of returnees, and vulnerable young people's exposure to violent extremist ideologies and actors. To address this risk, it is essential that government institutions at national and local level have capacity to identify drivers of violent extremism and to be able to deal with these drivers, plan and implement programmes for countering and preventing violent extremism at the local and national levels with focus on areas of return for families perceived as affiliated with ISIL

To address causes of violent extremism throughout the country and assist the Government of Iraq (GoI) in its efforts to prevent violent extremism and sustain the stabilization gains in a cohesive approach, UNDP supports the government to implement its 'National Strategy to Combat Violent Extremism Conducive to Terrorism (2019), with focus on the following objectives: 1) Build institutional capacity, at national and sub-national levels, to prevent and address Violent Extremism, 2) Enhance community resilience and promote viable pathways to reduce violent extremism (VE), with focus on women and youth. 3) Improve human security and stability through socio-economic support to most vulnerable groups to VE at local level. This support is grounded in a sustainable approach that addresses the governance, human rights, and socio-economic issues that create vulnerability to VE, under-development, and conflict, through support to implement Government of Iraq's National Strategy on P/CVE, National Security Strategy, and commitments under the 2030 Agenda. Support provided through by UNDP also prioritize women's empowerment and gender equality, including by building women's capacity to lead, participate in and contribute to the design and delivery of services and support provided in their communities, and wider society.

Under the guidance and direct supervision of the Team Leader of the Social Cohesion Pillar, the Technical Expert will provide strategic inputs at the policy and programming levels for PVE. The technical expert will assist in developing policy papers, briefs and research and represent UNDP in relevant technical forums

and working groups, He/She will also support in implementing the programmatic activities for PVE, follow up with the relevant team, engage with partners including government, UN agencies, development partners and International Organizations

3. Scope of Work

Within the framework of the UNDP Iraq Social Cohesion (SC) Program and under the guidance of the Team Leader of the Social Cohesion Pillar, the PVE Specialist will support UNDP's PVE efforts within the framework of the UNDP Iraq Social Cohesion Program. Key areas include:

- Provides strategic inputs to the Social Cohesion Team Leader for efficient development of programmes and implementation of activities on PVE
- Provide Thorough analysis of the situation of peace and violent extremism in the country and identification of strategic areas of support for UNDP with regards to PVE programmes.
- Provide technical advice on the development and implementation of PVE strategies and action plans
- Identify institutional development and capacity building opportunities and priorities for national and local partners working on PVE, where relevant.
- Advocates for UNDP's work on PVE and represent UNDP with national authorities, the donor community, and international financial institutions, where requested.
- Liaise and forge close linkages with other UN programs, agencies and entities, as well as other international and national stakeholders concerned with or providing assistance on PVE in Iraq, where requested
- Identify partnerships opportunities with non-governmental organizations, academic institutions and think tanks, UN Agencies, bi-lateral and multi-lateral donors, private sector.
- Analysis and research of information on donors, preparation of substantive briefs on possible areas of cooperation, identification of opportunities for initiation of new projects, active contribution to the overall office effort in resource mobilization.
- Identifies and synthesizes best practices and lessons learned from the programme for organizational sharing and learning as well as external information.
- Develop policy papers, briefs and research on within the PVE programme

The expert will be based in Iraq and directly supervised by the Social Cohesion Team Leader at UNDP Iraq. S/he is expected to work closely with program teams to advance the broader PVE agenda in UNDP.
